## **From College of Teachers. National Standards**

Thank you to those parents who attended the National Standards meetings. Out of these meetings submissions have been written and sent to our local MP, the Minister of Education and to the College of Teachers. The Board of Trustees, the Proprietor's and the College will also be making submissions. Dates have now been confirmed for next term for Steiner Schools around the country to meet and continue to work through the progressions and standards so that as a Steiner/Waldorf Movement there is clarity about where the National Standards fit with our pedagogy and curriculum. A big thank you to all of you who have already completed a response to the consultation materials. Over 1000 people have registered on the Research New Zealand website. **Extension for Closing date.** The Ministry has had requests to extend the closing date for the consultation. The responses to the consultation will be analysed and collated by Research New Zealand and the deadline for their report is 31 July, to feed in to standards writing group meetings in the week of 3 August. To complete this, Research New Zealand need to extract the data on Monday 6th July. The website will remain open until midnight on Sunday 5th July.

An exception will be made for responses to the Technology standards, because the consultation materials were released later than the other subjects. Feedback to the Technology standards will be accepted up to midnight on Wednesday 8th July.

Tenā koutou

### **Our vision. The kaupapa for our group**

We are aboard our waka, ready to sail! He waka eke noa, a canoe on which everyone may embark. Where are we heading to? Our ancestors have set the path: the path of learning. Which island are we heading for? The School's mandate also gave our thinking direction: "to ensure meaningful learning experiences for all students which acknowledge the land, the people and Te Tiriti o Waitangi".

### **What we meet as we step ashore. This is OUR VISION:**

We acknowledge the two pedagogical streams which carried us on our journey: the Anthroposophical wisdom of Rudolf Steiner and Te Matauranga Māori i Te Tangata Whenua. Our children's education integrates these streams. Tikanga Māori (custom/culture) is reflected in the routines, rhythms and the life of the School. Te Reo Māori is a living language and Ngā Kupu Māori weave in and out of the English language we speak here, in Aotearoa. Did you know.... at least six of every thousand words in New Zealand English are borrowed from Māori, which makes New Zealand English unique among the world's varieties of English. Our children grow up with a deep knowledge of all things Māori. They behave respectfully and are comfortable with Māori protocols and customs. Their education fosters an age appropriate appreciation of Māori history, culture and art. Some of our ancestors landed in wooden canoes. Some arrived by Air New Zealand. As our children understand the heritage we share, they acknowledge and take pride in all other heritage streams which carried them here, to this country, to this town, to this school and to our community.

How do we get to our island? Who will help navigate, and who will paddle? Is there a storyteller aboard our canoe? (And what about our kai?? Kapu coffee anyone? Watch this space).

## **CORNER OF THOUGHT**

We have often explained how the development of man takes place during the first periods of life, and it is many years since I first indicated how the child behaves to a great extent as an imitative being during the period up to the change of teeth. More or less instinctively and intensively he experiences all that is going on in his environment. Later on it is only in the sense organs that the processes of the outer world are thus intensively experienced, although we are not conscious of this fact. In our eyes, for example, we have a process imitating in a certain sense what is going on in the outer world reproducing it, just as the camera reproduces whatever is there in front of the lens. The human being becomes aware of what is thus imitatively reproduced in his eyes, and thus he gains information about the external world. It is the same with the other senses. But this restriction of the imitative principle to the periphery of the human organism occurs only at a later stage in life.

In early childhood, until the change of teeth, the whole body partakes in this imitative process, though to a lesser extent. At this stage the whole body is in a certain respect related to the outer world as the senses are during the rest of human life. The child is still in the main an imitative being. He follows the way in which outer things work in upon him and he imitates them internally. Hence it is very important to let nothing happen in the young child's environment, not even in the forming of our thoughts and feelings, which the child cannot rightly absorb and make his own.

With the change of teeth it begins to be possible for the child to behave no longer like a sense organ but to assimilate something in the nature of ideas. The child begins to take as his guideline what we say to him. Previously he has taken as his guideline all that we *did* in his environment; now he begins to grasp what we *say*. Authority thus becomes the decisive factor between the change of teeth and puberty. The child will quite naturally follow and be guided by what is said to him. Language itself he will of course learn by imitation, but that which is expressed and communicated through language, this can become a determining factor for the child only after the change of teeth. And a true power of judgement, when the child or adolescent begins to make his own faculty of judgement felt, comes only at the time of puberty. Not until then can the child begin to form real judgments of his own.

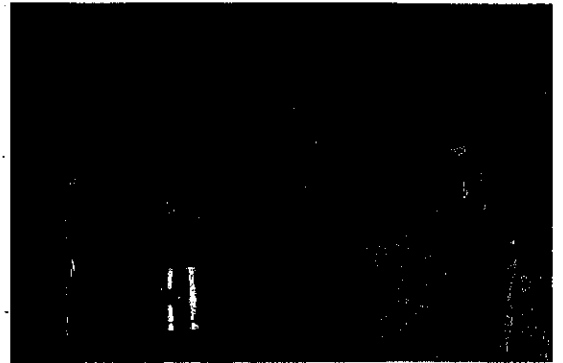
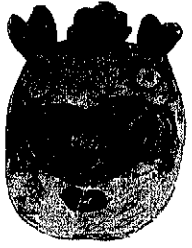
